Coming soon, our **Youth One Stop** will link at-risk youth to clinical crisis intervention and professional services for on-going care. When services can't be accessed due to financial or other barriers, Dial Help will provide services in-house via a new Social Worker and Family Support Worker. In this way, we hope to that ensure all youth receive the support they need, either in the community or from Dial Help.

24/7 PHONE, TEXT, CHAT, & WALK-IN CRISIS LINE

Available UP-wide to help people develop a plan to cope or stay safe.

SAFETY NET PROGRAM

Follow-up support UP-wide for individuals with suicide risk, loss of a loved one to suicide, intense crisis, or Substance Use Disorder.

MOBILE RESPONSE TEAM

Responds to requests from schools and agencies in the four-county area to provide face-to-face crisis intervention and connection to resources.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE YOUTH PREVENTION

Curriculum-based school programming and Communities That Care (CTC) youth prevention coalition.

FAMILY SUPPORT SERVICES

Working in-home with at-risk families to prevent child abuse and neglect.

VICTIM SERVICES TEAM

Free counseling, advocacy, and court accompaniment, with 24-hour emergency response to victims of any type of crime.

SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER SERVICES

Offering Drug & Alcohol Assessments and Outpatient Counseling for individuals dealing with substance abuse/addiction.

EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT SUICIDE ASSESSMENTS

Determining suicide risk for patients at UP Health Systems Portage.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION

Alcohol Highway Safety Classes, Domestic Violence Intervention Program, Anger Management Classes, Community Crisis Intervention Training, Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST), and other trainings as needed.
